Pocahontas County Is Number One In Corn

The official 1985 preliminary yield estimates just released by the Iowa Crop and Livestock Reporting Service puts Pocahontas top among the counties in Iowa with a yield of 146.4 bushels of corn per acre.

Following Pocahontas were Hardin, 146.0; Kossuth, 142.4; Franklin, 140.3; and Hamilton, 140.1. The state average was 126.0.

Scott County led the state in soybean yield with 45.1 bushels followed by Cedar, 451; Washington, 42.0; and Des Moines, Hardin, Grund and Harrison, all with a yield per acre of 41.7. Pocahontas had 39.5. The state average was 380.

The crop report sets the Pocahontas County corn crop at 24.621.000 bushels grown on 168,200 acres. Soybean acreage was 147,300 which produced 5,819,000 bushels.

Mel Powers, County Extension Director, pointed out that while these preliminary yield estimates will likely be revised over the next year or more before they go into the crop history books, there is little chance that 1985 will not be Pocahontas County's best corn year. The previous county record was in 1981 with 139.6 bushels. 1978 continues to stand as the best soybean year with 43.7 bushels per acre.

Farm Pogram **Changes Announced**

A recent amendment to the Ford Security Act of 1985 changed some requirements of the 1986 farm programs.

Dennis D. Olson, an official of the county Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS), says cross compliance will not be required of farmers participating in the acreage reduction programs for feed grains.

When cross compliance is in effect, none of the crop acreage based for a participating farm may be exceeded. Since this requirement is not in effect for the 1986 programs, Olson says farms not participating for a crop may exceed the crop acreage base for that crop.

According to Olson, crop acreage bases for feed grain will be based upon the aveage acres planted and considered planted to such commodities for each of the five crop years immediately preceding the crop year for which the determinatión is made.

Farmers who do not believe a base or yield was correctly extablished may file an appeal with the local ASCS office.
